

$$47.) f(x) = \arctan(e^x)$$

$$f'(x) = \frac{e^x}{1+(e^x)^2} = \frac{e^x}{1+e^{2x}}$$

$$(67) \quad y = 4x \arccos(x-1) \quad (1, 2\pi)$$

$$y' = 4x \cdot \frac{-1}{\sqrt{1-(x-1)^2}} + \arccos(x-1) \cdot 4$$

$$y'(1) = \frac{-4}{1} + \arccos(0) \cdot 4$$

$$= -4 + \frac{\pi}{2} \cdot 4 = (-4 + 2\pi)$$

$$y - 2\pi = (-4 + 2\pi)(x - 1)$$

5.7 Inverse Trigonometric Functions: Integration

- Integrate functions whose antiderivatives involve inverse trigonometric functions.
- Use the method of completing the square to integrate a function.
- Review the basic integration rules involving elementary functions.

These are the last techniques of integration. Get ready to think! You need to consider all of the methods when deciding how to find an integral.

Arcsin:

$$= \arcsin \frac{x}{2} + C$$

$$u = x$$

$$du = dx$$

$$a = 2$$

check:

$$\frac{\frac{1}{2}}{\sqrt{1-\frac{x^2}{4}}} = \frac{\frac{1}{2}}{\sqrt{\frac{4-x^2}{4}}}$$

$$= \frac{1}{\sqrt{4-x^2}}$$

arcsin

$$u = 2x$$

$$du = 2dx$$

$$a = 1$$

$$\int \frac{du}{a^2+u^2} = \frac{1}{a} \arctan \frac{u}{a} + c$$

#7: Solve the differential equation

$$\int \frac{dy}{dx} = \int \frac{2}{9+x^2} dx \quad (0, 2)$$

$$u = x \\ du = dx \\ a = 3$$

$$y = \int \frac{2}{9+x^2} dx$$

$$y = \frac{2}{3} \arctan \frac{x}{3} + C$$

$$2 = C$$

$$y = 2 \int \frac{1}{9+x^2} dx$$

$$y = \frac{2}{3} \arctan \frac{x}{3} + 2$$

THEOREM 5.17 INTEGRALS INVOLVING INVERSE TRIGONOMETRIC FUNCTIONS

Let u be a differentiable function of x , and let $a > 0$.

$$1. \int \frac{du}{\sqrt{a^2 - u^2}} = \arcsin \frac{u}{a} + C \quad 2. \int \frac{du}{a^2 + u^2} = \frac{1}{a} \arctan \frac{u}{a} + C$$

$$3. \int \frac{du}{u\sqrt{u^2 - a^2}} = \frac{1}{a} \operatorname{arcsec} \frac{|u|}{a} + C$$
